We are reading...



English – Writing - We shall be basing our writing on three different texts which highlight the individual experiences of people who were affected during the period of the Slave Trade. We shall be writing recounts, biographies and short narratives based on their reading. Alongside this, we shall be developing some key grammatical skills needed for these writing genres: subordinate and coordinate conjunctions, speech punctuation and

Computing – This half term we will be using iPads to shoot and create a short advert to promote a pre-selected item. Children will be looking at what makes an advert effective and how products are promoted using different media platforms.

Maths - We will use our place value knowledge to read, order and compare numbers, as well as looking at negative numbers. We will focus on using the written methods for the 4 main operations, and then using these to complete multi-step problems and word problems.

English – Reading - We shall be studying two keys texts this half term: 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman and the National Geographic Infopedia. We shall be focusing on and developing key reading skills with a specific focus each week. For example, fluency, retrieval, inference, deduction and predication.

This half term in Year 6...

RE - In R.E. we will be looking at how the Christian message has been spread for the last 2000 years. We will look at Jesus' and his disciples' roles in spreading this message and compare equivalencies to the modern day.

History / Geography - We shall be answering the question 'Why did people in Hackney give up sugar' by learning about the Transatlantic Slave Trade. We shall be mapping out which countries were involved, what experiences people had in this historical time and how Hackney has changed from the period of the Slave Trade.

Science - We will begin to understand how water and nutrients are transported around the body. We will look at the effects of sugar on the body and take part in our own investigations to see how much 'hidden sugar' there can be in various foods.
