### Reading

In reading lessons, we will follow the RWI scheme, children will practise skills such as segmenting and blending to read words, partner talk and comprehension. You can support your child by reading with them daily and books will be given weekly, please do return them so new books can be given.

### RE

This term focuses on Christianity, specifically the creation story. Children will begin to understand why it is important to care for our world and immediate surroundings. RE lessons will be rich in discussions and opportunities in which your child can ask and answer questions.

### Computing

This term your child will understand the meaning of an 'algorithm'. They will learn to use directional language to plan a route that will later be used to direct a Beebot from one location to another.

### PE days

PE this term is on **Mondays**. Please ensure children come to school in the correct PE uniform.

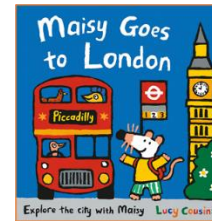
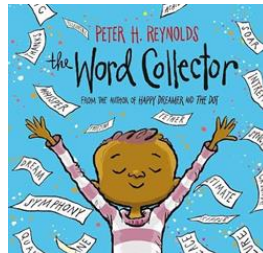
### Writing

Our writing cycle follows the sequence of a recount and then retelling a story. Learning a story through a story map will help the children to understand chronological order and sentence structure. The cycle allows for children to become authors as they develop their spelling and punctuation. There will be a focus on letter formation as well as phonics within each writing session.

### Maths

This term we will be focusing on place value, children will learn fundamental counting skills and begin to understand the relationships between numbers up to 10 and beyond. Throughout the term we will be developing key language and the ability to reason and justify.

### History / Geography

Our topic this term is 'On The Bus'. Your child will be developing navigational skills such as map reading and using a compass. As well as this, we will be using observation skills to help annotate and discuss images of London in the past and present.

### Science

Science this term is closely linked to our learning in geography. We will explore London and observe the weather through the comfort of a bus. Exploring language, investigation, and observation skills across the term. We will use simple equipment to measure and record data
