Key dates



Reading

The children will continue to take part in whole class reading sessions. We will be focusing on fact and opinion, descriptive and figurative language, asking questions for clarity and finding information in the text amongst others. We will explore a variety of texts, fiction and nonfiction and discuss how the author has used language to convey the characters thoughts and feelings.

Maths

This term the children will use their knowledge of place value and applying their knowledge to money. For example, they will make links between their knowledge of hundredths to the fact that there are 100 pennies in 1 pound. Children will be learning about quantities of money, linking in their knowledge of decimals number from the last term. We will continue to focus on adding and subtracting both mentally and through using column method. Throughout the term children will continue to expanding their learning of folding word problems.

Writing

In writing, we will continue to explore creative writing along with a variety of grammar skills such as: apostrophes, relative clauses, parenthesis, modal verbs and adverbial phrases. This term our writing outcomes will include writing fables, narratives, brochures and persuasive letters around our topic, 'The Company'.

History / Geography

We will study the history of trade, focusing on The East India Company, comparing different eras and identifying the impact of trade on the world today. We will describe the periods of change in trade, use evidence from different sources, use a range of maps and atlases and look at rebellions and the role of James Lancaster.

Science

This half term we will be focusing on materials. We will begin by looking at the different spices that could have been traded on the Silk Road and describing their properties. We will look at reversible and irreversible reactions and look at different ways to separate different mixtures and solutions. We will experiment with dissolving to see which materials are soluble, and which are insoluble.



RE

In RE, we will be investigating and exploring the principles behind, "How do art and music convey Christmas?", with the core concept being incarnation. Our focus will be Christianity, making links to other religions from prior learning. We will also examine the representation of Christmas in painting and carols.

Computing

We are web developers: Children will learn how websites are produced and publish their own website on the topic of the history of trade. We will also be looking at encryption and the need to keep information safe and secure, as well as looking at safe passwords.
