Key dates



Maths

This term, we shall be first looking at the four operations before moving on to fractions, decimals and percentages. We will be adding, subtracting, timesing and dividing with fractions and decimals before finding equivalents and using this knowledge to solve various reasoning word problems.

RE

In RE, we shall be exploring the big question 'How do Christians advertise Christmas?'. We shall be looking at both religious and secular advertisements for Christmas and comparing them to gospel passages before making our own adverts to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.

Computing

In computing, students will be evolving their digital literacy; combining research, writing, mapping, photo, video and audio importing capabilities. Cross-curricular elements of geography and writing will be embedded in this unit. Students will create an online medium where they will be writing and recording virtual travel.

PE days

PE this term is on **Wednesday and Thursday.**Please ensure children are wearing the correct kit for PE: house colour t-shirt, school jumper and navy joggers/leggings.

Reading

This term we shall be looking at inspirational figures of protest, including those involved in the civil rights movement. We will be reading the texts 'once' and 'holes', and using these to answer different types of questions, such as impression questions, using inference and ordering.

Writing

We shall be using texts of people who have protested for change. This will begin with 'no voice too small', where we will be creating protest poetry. We will then use the texts written by Malala Yussafzai and Nelson Mandela to write persuasive speeches and formal letters.

History / Geography

In History, we will be looking at influential figures who have harnessed the power of protest to change the world. We will look at different forms of protest including; letters, petitions, music, strikes and marching and their effectiveness to enable change. We will look at historical protests in our local community from the battle of Cable street to Rock against Racism in Victoria Park and the East End Match Girls Strike.

Science

In science, we shall be looking at the work of Charles Darwin and the theory of evolution. We will look at adapted and inherited characteristics, and how these can change over time as living things adapt to their environment. We will examine how this can be proved using the fossil record.
