### *Reading*

*PE this term is on Mondays and Tuesdays. Please ensure children come to school in the correct PE uniform.*

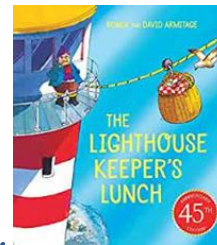
### *Writing*

### *Maths*

We will begin by looking at division and grouping with remainders. We will then look again at place value addition and subtraction. Please encourage your child to use My Maths to practise homework at home.

### *History / Geography*

This unit of work is about identity as we consider the food on our own plates. Children will gain an insight as to the way in which food is transported around or in an interconnected world. Your child will learn where their food comes from. They will gain an understanding of the origins of food and why they need to be transported to Britain.

### *Science*

In science we will learn about animals and the foods they eat; children will sort them by their diet and develop scientific language. As well as this we will discuss the food that we need to eat to stay healthy.
